

+This family actively lives their Faith. Parents guide their children showing compassionate love to all. The woman tenderly cares for the aged, dirty, tattered man marginalized on the edge of society; a shackled prisoner kindly fed and tended to as their young daughter is guided and encouraged by her father. Unknowingly, they minister to the Hidden Jesus, the Divine Person, Who Lives Among Us.

+The cares of the world can challenge and overwhelm us all. This widowed mother and orphaned children struggle to find shelter and safety. She is well-worn and exhausted beyond measure as her son points to their plight. The local ministers of the ancient church, its deacon & presbyters, or its bishop rush to bring food, consolation, encouragement, with keys in hand (meaning both leadership of office and offering a place to stay.

In the Arches Above: The arches and their stone tracery symbolize the umbrella of the universal Church supported by the columns below as the architectural edifice that gathers the People of God. The birds of the air nests comfortably in its rafters above, as is often the case with any large open structure. The classical form of the ecclesial design is Romanesque, the primary influence of our own Mission style sacred space. The concentric circles, patterns, and arches form the purple Cross centered above which show its consecration and dedication to Christ. The pattern of the four intersecting circles is a classical *quatrefoil* design, and is reminiscent of the lambs tongue design in the metal grill work used throughout our sanctuary.

The dynamic force of the Holy Spirit inhabits and pervades this sacred space; its radiant grace spills over and illumines the spiritual community below who are dedicated, gathered, and live in Christ.

'The Same Church of Today Window' Images From Left to Right

+This friendly, caring Asian woman is pregnant; she exudes hospitality and a welcoming spirit. Perhaps she is single, perhaps she is part of a couple with the young man next to her (who might be Haitian), perhaps married, perhaps not, perhaps divorced, or widowed? We simply don't know, nor are we meant to judge. The young Latino woman is married to her husband who lives with a physical disability. Their rings show their sacramental marriage covenant, perhaps he suffers a traumatic injury that greatly challenged their life but enabled them to grow deeper in authentic persevering love as a couple? All of them convey the broad makeup and inclusive diversity of our Church.

+The vibrant mature woman with a cane and cowboy hat is engaging, empathetic, and compassionate. She listens attentively with tears in her eyes as the younger woman with a darker complexion (who is perhaps East Asian, Indian, or Srilankan) expresses herself with sincerity, as she gently holds the hand of her precocious toddler, who in turn holds the hand of his Teddy Bear. These women mutually minister to each other despite their apparent differences they realize an extraordinary shared commonality.

+These two men seemingly have different priorities. One has lived his life and finally found meaningful purpose, the other struggles with addiction and is unable to live other than moment to moment; he makes bad choices with a past that continually haunts him. Between them both the monetary help that is asked for is exchanged with the offer of a life altering care and personal investment of time given by a man who is himself repaying his own debt out of the generosity he himself received when he too was struggling.

In the Arches Above: The same beautiful structure that is Church shelters us and provides sanctuary especially in the havoc of our modern world. The same Holy Spirit is ever present, yet manifest in different ways. Here the Spirit is a breeze (Greek: *pneuma*) wind, or breath that moves through and around us and our lives inspiring, protecting, guiding us ultimately along the course God has laid out for us; if only we learn to trust and cooperate with It. The cat, above, is nestled in slumber, someone's pet or perhaps simply an adopted member of the parish, who like us, has come to realize where it Belongs

Windows Overall Unitive Themes

- <u>Everyone Is Given A Hallow</u>. A life lived in Holiness is the Vocation that each of us is called to as followers of Jesus and members of the Body of Christ. So, each person in this spiritual journey no matter where they are on it, bears their own hallow, and as St. Paul addressed his epistles to early believers 'You are the Saints and Holy Ones'.
- <u>We Are Drawn Together In Christ's Self-Giving Love So We Too Must Love Sincerely.</u> We are all imperfect sinners who are challenged by our struggles yet called to loving service to each other. - <u>The Ever Present Holy Spirit Inspires & Guides the Church</u>. The Holy Spirit with great unction fills the life of the Church, the *ecclesia*, illuminating, inspiring, always guiding the People of God. The Spirit is the promised radiant hope, the Flame that carried the Early Church, yet also the wind, the breeze, the Divine Breathe of God that in-fills our lives and is always Present in the Church.
- Loving & Respecting God's Creation. Our Faith opens and elevates our hearts and minds to an awareness of a Divine Reality, yet we live our earthly lives in the natural world we share with all Creation as we strive to live in mindful harmony with all things.
- <u>The Gift We Have Been Given Must Now Be Freely Given To Others</u>. What has been 'handed on" to us we ought to inform and guide and nurture our children in: to comfort the sick, to care for the widowed and the orphaned, the poor, to have compassion for all, even the imprisoned, and those shackled on the edge of society for in our unselfish ministry to them we minister to the Hidden Christ Who Is Present Among Us.
- <u>We are All of Diverse Backgrounds & Differences United In Christ</u>. The great diversity of peoples and backgrounds are present to us as we live out our Christian life. Many, many, races, ethnicities, ages, and *attitudes* are here present to us and it is in this that our charity must become the bridge to unite us.




